

## North Bay Canoe Club Medical Response and Management of Athletes - Camp Participants with Suspected COVID-19

If a participant begins to experience symptoms of COVID-19 while attending camp activities, it is recommended that:

- Symptomatic camp participants are immediately separated from others in a supervised area until they can go home. In addition, where possible, anyone who is providing care to the camp participant should maintain a distance of at least 2metres

- Parent or guardian are immediately contacted so they can pick up camp participant and ensure the necessary medical steps are taken to respond to possible Covid-19 infection.

- If a 2-metre distance cannot be maintained from the ill camp participant, the local public health unit should be contacted to obtain advice on the best way to prevent/limit virus transmission to those providing care.

- (Call the North Bay Public health unit at the number above to notify them of a potential case) or advise parent or guardian to do so.... and seek advice regarding the information that should be shared with other parents/guardians of camp participants in the program.

- While contacting the Public health Unit, at a minimum the program participant and staff member should wear a surgical/procedure mask (if tolerated) and the staff member should also wear eye protection (goggles or face shield)

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Camp participants should be reminded of hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette while waiting to be picked up.</li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Tissues should be provided to the camp participant to support proper disposal of the tissues</li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Environmental cleaning/disinfection of the space and items used by the camp should be conducted once the camp participant has been picked up. Items that cannot be cleaned and disinfected (eg. paper, books) should be removed from the program and stored in a sealed container for a minimum of 7 days.</li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Camp participants with symptoms should be tested. (see COVID -19 Testing section below for further information)</li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Camp participants or staff who have been exposed to a confirmed case of COVID-19 should be excluded from the program setting for 14 days.</li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Club officials will initiate the closure of club and programs based on a Positive test result or until clear direction and approval to continue operating is provided by the North Bay Health Unit.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Testing for COVID-19</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Symptomatic staff and camp participants should be referred for testing. Testing of asymptomatic persons should only be performed as directed by the local public health unit as part of case/contact and outbreak management.</li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Those who test negative for COVID-19 must be excluded from the program until 24 hours after symptom resolution. If a symptomatic person receives a negative result, a repeat test with 24-48 hours can be considered if clinical suspicion is high.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Those who test positive for COVID-19 must be excluded from the program for 14 days after the onset of symptoms and clearance has been received from the North Bay Public Health Unit.</li></ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Day camps must consider a single, symptomatic, laboratory confirmed case of COVID-19 in a staff member or camp participant as a confirmed COVID-19 outbreak in consultation with the North Bay Public Health Unit. Outbreaks should be declared in collaboration between the program and the Health Unit to ensure an outbreak number is provided.</li></ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Camp participants or staff who have been in contact with a suspected COVID-19 case should be monitored for symptoms and further cohorted (i.e., grouped together) until laboratory tests, if any, have been completed or until directed by the North Bay</li><li>• health unit.</li></ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Staff members and camp participants awaiting test results should be excluded from camp.</li></ul>
